

**PUBLIC NOTICE OF PROPOSED PROJECTS TO BE FUNDED
USING PASSENGER FACILITY CHARGES**

The Huntsville-Madison County Airport Authority is considering the following projects for Passenger Facility Charge Funding:

Projects	Amount of Use Approval
<p>#110 - Security System Replacement/Upgrade (FAA grant: 3-01-0042-077-2016)</p> <p>This project replaces the airport's current security system with a new system based on current technology, which will enhance the security of airport operations.</p>	\$767,254
<p>#111 - Snow Removal Equipment (FAA grant: 3-01-0042-077-2016)</p> <p>This project adds additional snow removal equipment to the airport's fleet, for the purpose of helping insure the airport can respond quickly and remain open during a snow event, minimize delays to the travelling public and enhance the safety of aircraft operations.</p>	125,000
<p>#112 - Terminal/Concourse Public Area Design (FAA grant: 3-01-0042-077-2016)</p> <p>The terminal and concourse facilities were constructed in 1989, and some support systems are fifty years old. To support current and future passenger requirements, upgrades and modifications to the elevators, escalators, and restrooms must be made. This project will fund the design of these changes.</p>	125,483
<p>4D (FAA grant: 3-01-0042-078-2016, 3-01-0042-080-2017, 3-01-0042-083-2018)</p> <p>This project is for the construction of the portions of taxiway Charlie north and south of the air cargo ramp. This taxiway will meet the standards pertaining to the largest aircraft that operate at the airport, allowing all aircraft to access the air cargo apron from either runway without crossing the active east runway, and also to mitigate the closure of the east runway in the event that Taxiway Echo is closed.</p>	5,028,683
<p>#114 - Airport Master Plan (FAA grant: 3-01-0042-079-2016)</p> <p>The airport is required by FAA regulations to periodically update its master plan, which helps the airport plan for growth and changes required by that growth, thereby sustaining the airport's role in the national transportation system.</p>	174,680

#115 - Pavement Rehabilitation (FAA grant: 3-01-0042-081-2017, 3-01-0042-082-2018)	183,729
<p>This project will rehabilitate concrete and pavement areas on the air carrier ramp, the air cargo ramp, and Taxiway Juliet, which extends the life of the pavement and helps insure the safety of operating aircraft.</p>	
#116 - Terminal Rehabilitation - Jet Bridges Phase 3 (FAA grant: 3-01-0042-081-2017, 3-01-0042-082-2018)	451,336
<p>This project is the final funding phase related to the installation of new jet bridges at the airport's passenger gates, replacing the thirty-year bridges that exceeded their useful lives. It also equips each jet bridge with Pre-Conditioned Air Units, that cool or heat the aircraft interior without using aircraft power, a safety and environmental benefit.</p>	
#117 - Interactive Employee (Security) Training Learning Suite Upgrade (FAA grant: 3-01-0042-081-2017)	15,000
<p>Any person who is granted access to the airport is required to complete security training. This project replaces the end-of-life system with a new system that reflects current airport operations and security standards.</p>	
#118 - Terminal Area Rehab-Rear Canopy (FAA grant: 3-01-0042-082-2018)	55,458
<p>Passenger baggage is processed in the rear of the terminal building. This project adds a canopy to protect workers and equipment from the weather during baggage processing.</p>	
#119 - Pavement Rehabilitation - Taxiway Echo (FAA grant: future)	1,350,000
<p>This project rehabilitates the end-of-life pavement from Taxiway Echo and replaces the end-of-life in-ground lighting associated with this taxiway.</p>
